7. Presidents Report

Dr Elizabeth Lavender presented some key highlights:

- **Departure of Board Member:** The departure of board member Susan Hogan (July 2025) was acknowledged.
- **Dr. Beverley Wood's Non-renomination:** Dr. Beverley Wood will not renominate for the board but will continue her involvement with the Heritage and Scholarship Committees.
- **Strategic Plan:** The Board continued refining the strategic plan, originally developed in 2018, with a focus on the core functions of commemoration and the awarding of scholarships.
- **Updated Priorities:** The Board updated its priorities with two key goals:
 1. To preserve and protect historical assets, including digitization of archives and heritage preservation.
 2. To strengthen the ANMC's national profile by presenting the Centre as both a living memorial and a forward-looking organization.
- **Modernisation and Efficiency:** To align with Board capacity and improve efficiency, the ANMC now has four core committees:
 - The Executive Committee
 - The Finance, Risk, and Compliance Committee
 - The Scholarship Committee
 - The Heritage Committee
- **Scholarship Program:** The Scholarship Program, chaired by Emerita Professor Maxine Duke AM, undertook significant work this year, including the formation of an Alumni Working Party led by Dr. Susan Lee and generously supported by the Rosemary Norman Foundation.
- **2025 Scholarship Round:** The 2025 scholarship round received a record 88 applications, resulting in 25 interviews and 16 scholarships awarded.
- **Increased Donor Generosity:** There was increased donor generosity for the following scholarships:
 - The Michael Dent Scholarship
 - The Prince Henry's Past Nurses Scholarship
 - The Beth Cuthbertson Award
- **Heritage Committee Reconstitution:** The former History and Heritage Committee has been reconstituted as the Heritage Committee, now with broader responsibilities, including aspects of marketing and donor engagement.
- **Successful Events:** Notable successful events included:
 - The Anzac Commemorative Service
 - The scholarship evening held in March
 - The 80th anniversary of the liberation of Australian Army nurses
 - The 75th anniversary celebrations at Government House, attended by the Governor-General
- **New Partnerships:** Partnerships were established with the Australian College of Nursing Foundation and the Australian Veterans Arts Museum.
- **Anzac Day Drop-In Lunch:** The Anzac Day drop-in lunch was reintroduced after five years. Held in April, it featured a march followed by coffee and sandwiches at the Centre.
- **Vale:** Tribute to two dear friends of the Centre, Mr. Floyd Allen and Miss Diane Whitehead. Their contributions will not be forgotten.

Administration

The administration of the ANMC continues to evolve as we expand our reach. The Board has introduced a new addition to the administrative team, Malu Faatele, as an Administrative Assistant, who will work alongside our Centre Manager, Elizabeth Allwood. Both continue to deliver exceptional work, overseeing everything from venue hire to stakeholder engagement. Their efforts are integral to the Centre's growth and smooth operation. Thanks to them both for their hard work and dedication.

The Chair took the opportunity to thank all Board and Committee members for their continued support. The passion and commitment they have shown are a testament to their confidence in the future of the Australian Nurses Memorial Centre.
